Fire Marshal and Emergency Evacuation Coordinator

Aim

- To look at company specific fire safety and evacuation policy procedures.

Method of Evaluation

Evaluation is achieved by means of a multiple choice question paper that is completed within 30 minutes the correct answers are established in a group with delegates taking in turns to read out the question and what they think is the correct answer. The evaluation of the practical firefighting session is done by the instructor if he/she deems the delegate capable of carrying out the task safely.

Health & Safety

M-Fire takes health and safety very seriously, all tasks that we carry out from engineering and training to operational fire fighting have been carefully looked at by our own Health & Safety advisors, risk assessments and method statements have been carried out to protect our clients, staff and members of the general public.

The practical session of the fire marshal course involves lighting a real fire in a controlled environment by the instructor. Delegates will take it in turns and be asked to select the correct extinguisher according to the class of fire, using knowledge gained in the theory part of the course. The delegate will then approach the fire and safely extinguish the flames. This would be done under strict supervision of the instructor and the delegate would be required to wear a fire tunic, safety glasses, fire helmet with visor down and gloves. Suitable footwear and trousers/long skirt must be worn by the delegate in order to participate in the practical session of the course.

Long Term Evaluation

The delegates will receive an A4 certificate as proof of attendance which currently lasts for 3 years. It is strongly advised that the client runs a refresher course every three years. After successfully completing an M-Fire Fire Marshal and EEC course the delegates will have a much greater understanding of the risk fire poses in the workplace and be better equipped to support a safe working environment including the skills required to carry out the duties of a fire marshal in the workplace.

The delegates will also understand the role of the emergency evacuation coordinator including the risk of environmental, bomb, terrorist attack and structural collapse, and the need for such a roll in today's ever changing world. Delegates will be more aware of the issues surrounding these threats in the workplace and encourage a safer working environment with the skills required to deal with many different types of emergency evacuation scenarios should the need arise.
